

### WHS incident reporting summary

### **Employee incident/injury**

1. WorkCover Notifiable Incident: (See definition on the right)

Report immediately to WHS Directorate on 1800 811 523.

2. For all other injuries/incidents:

Call the Incident Notification Hotline on **1800 811 523** within 24 hrs.

Paper based <u>employee incident or injury</u> <u>notification forms</u> are accessible on the intranet if a hotline report cannot be made.

# Student/visitor/contractor incident/injury

1. WorkCover Notifiable Incident: (See definition on the right)

Report immediately to WHS Directorate on 1800 811 523.

2. All other injury/incidents that have arisen from an identifiable hazard:

Call the Incident Notification Hotline on **1800 811 523** within 24 hrs.

An identifiable hazard is an item or thing that can be rectified or adjusted to reduce or eliminate a recurrence of a similar injury/incident.

Paper based <u>non-employee incident or injury</u> <u>notification forms</u> are accessible on the intranet if a hotline report cannot be made.

**Note** – The Department's <u>Incident Reporting Procedures</u> outline other departmental reporting requirements which must be met including requirements by:

- Legal Services school accident reports
- Safety and Security eg violence, weapons, illegal drugs or other criminal activity
- Media eg death, major complaint/criticism of departmental activities, unfavourable media
- EPAC eg child protection, criminal conduct
- Regional Asset Management Unit eg asbestos related incidents.

#### What is a WorkCover notifiable incident?

#### **Fatality**

The death of a person

#### Serious injury or illness requiring immediate treatment

As an in-patient in hospital

Amputation

Serious head or eye injury or serious burn

Separation of skin from underlying tissue eg de-gloving/ scalping

Spinal injury

Loss of bodily function

Serious laceration

#### Other serious injury or illness

Exposure to a substance, which requires medical treatment within 48 hrs

Prescribed illnesses directly attributable to work with micro-organisms, or
involving treatment or care of a person, contact with human blood or body
substance or contact with animals

The following zoonoses contracted through contact with animals: Q fever, anthrax, leptospirosis, brucellosis, Hendra virus, avian flu, psittacosis

## A dangerous incident exposing an employee or other person to a serious risk to their health or safety emanating from an immediate or imminent exposure to:

Uncontrolled escape, spillage or leakage of a substance

Uncontrolled implosion, explosion or fire

Uncontrolled escape of gas steam or pressured substance

Electric shock

Fall from height of any plant, substance or thing

Collapse, overturning, failure or malfunction of, or damage to, any plant that is required to be authorised for use in accordance with the regulations

Collapse or partial collapse of a structure, or excavation including shoring supporting an excavation

An inrush of water, mud or gas in an underground excavation or tunnel Interruption of underground ventilation
